
#### **TYBEE'S SEA ANEMONES**

Tybee's rock jetties are one of my favorite habitats to explore because of the variety of animals and seaweeds that live there, requiring a solid structure for attachment and survival. Within this community, you will see some dark brown, roundish blobs attached to the rocks among the oysters. Usually, they are back in the crevices and cracks. Those soft, brown blobs are one of the types of Sea Anemones that we find on Tybee.

Anemones are very simple. The body is like a cup, with its base attached to something hard (rock or shell) and with its opening at top. The opening is surrounded by tentacles. Anemones use their tentacles to capture food and pull it into its mouth. Digestion occurs down inside the cup, in an area called its gastrovascular cavity. An Anemone can regulate the amount of water in the cavity, so its body size can range from short to long. It can also shorten its tentacles, withdraw them inward, and close its opening, to help from drying out

Those dark brown ones in the rock jetties are Warty Sea Anemones. They live strongly attached back in the crevices, cracks, and even hanging on the underside of rocks in the mid and low intertidal zone. During low tide, it looks like a dark brown, wet blob because its tentacles are withdrawn to help keep from drying out. If attached to the underside of a rock, it might be elongated and hanging down a few inches, as if stretching downward trying to reach a tide pool below. Underwater in a tide pool, its tentacles will be extended, and it will look like an Anemone is supposed to look. If you can reach it, gently put your finger on its tentacles and feel how they will stick to you. It doesn't sting. It's soft, with no protection, so if you touch it, do it gently.

Also on the rock jetties are the very small, inconspicuous, Orange-striped Anemone. They are tiny, bright green and attached to Oyster shells in the mid intertidal zone. They are easily overlooked because they are so small. When







the tide is out and they are exposed, they will be closed up and look like small splatters of lime Jello scattered on ovster shells. But when submerged, they will open up and spread their green tentacles.

A third type of Anemone we find on Tybee is the Tri-color Anemone (aka Hermit Crab Anemone). They often have broad vertical brown and beige bands along their side, but their mouth is usually very bright orange or pink. They like to attach to shells being used by Hermit Crabs. But they will also attach to objects drifting around in the water (Rubbery Bryozoans, Whelk egg cases, even plastic trash). On Tybee, they will wash ashore and look like a brown lump attached to something else. If you find one, put it in some seawater and usually within a few minutes it will open up, spread its tentacles, and you can see its colorful mouth.

#### **CORNED BEEF & CABBAGE WITH A TYBEE TWSIT**



#### Ingredients:

Corned Beef - sold in prepackaged condition from Kroger - buy the one that comes with the spices included

1 bag Par-Cook Carrots

1 bag of Baby Red Potatoes

Garlic Powder

Minced Onion

Italian Seasoning

Salt and Pepper

Olive Oil

1 Cabbage - small

#### Instructions:

As a heads up on the seasonings, the exact ingredients aren't spelled out because, as Joy so eloquently says, "A real cook doesn't measure shit!" That having been

Step One: Just follow the instructions on the Corned Beef package. Joy cooked it the night before the actual event because it takes 3 hours, and I don't have time for all that nonsense.

Step Two: Preheat the oven to 400 degrees. Strain the carrots and cut the potatoes in half. Mix the carrots and taters with garlic powder, minced onion, Italian Seasoning and salt and pepper. Coat the entire situation with olive oil. Throw it in the oven for 45 minutes.

Step Three: Slice your cabbage and spray frying pan with olive oil. Lay the first layer of cabbage and season with salt and pepper. Then add a second layer of cabbage and season with salt and pepper. Add one more layer with remaining cabbage and season. Keep your skillet on medium and turn your concoction sporadically until all is brown. Then plate it up with the Corned Beef and Taters! It feeds four and is so good! The only downside to this is the prep and cooking

### From the Mayor's Desk

#### WHY DOES WYOMING HATE US?

I have the privilege to attend many many meetings now. I had no idea. Meetings where I sit for hours, learn so much, and eat snacks. There are so many groups here on Tybee, associations and groups in Chatham County, agencies and departments in the State, and agencies and departments in the federal government. All with an interest in preserving and improving Tybee, Most with money that we need. I don't mind begging.

I enjoyed meeting with the Friends of Cockspur Lighthouse (cockspurislandlighthouse.com). Under the current leadership of Harvey Ferrelle, they are effectively encouraging our federal partners at the National Park Service, Fort Pulaski National Monument to preserve and protect this fascinating structure. They are also working, along with other groups, to encourage the Georgia Ports Authority to rebuild the south jetty of the Savannah River Channel. Tybee needs this to protect our north end. The dunes are washing away. Councilmember Tony Ploughe is also leading an effort to preserve the dunes on the north end. Look for more on that in upcoming meetings.


One of the most fascinating groups is Savannah Area Chamber of Commerce Visit Tybee Island. They are our official marketing organization with a \$2 million budget. They study our visitors and provide some interesting information in their 2024 Business Plan and Budget. Forty percent of our visitors stay an average of 4.5 nights. Sixty percent stay 3-5 hours. In 2022, our day visitors each spent \$59 per day. \$7 of that was for parking. Our overnight visitors each spent \$106 per day. Where did they spend it? Mostly in restaurants, but also on groceries, recreation, tours, entertainment, shopping, local transportation (if they know the owner), and parking (in that order).

Most of our visitors were middle aged (69%) and came from right here in Georgia (39%). Others were from North Carolina, followed by South Carolina, Tennessee, Ohio, and Kentucky. In fact, we had visitors from every state in the United States, Except Wyoming. We even had 0.4% international visitors. But not Wyoming.


The total direct spending from visitors in 2022 was almost \$530 million, affecting over 8,000 jobs. The financial impact for the city was over \$10 million. The best part - 80% of the revenue generated was in just 20% of the year (10 weeks) - from Memorial Day to the end of July. With a few exceptions, we were peaceful for 42 weeks.


The third group of interest to our community is the Memorial Park Plan Task Force. Hopefully, by the time you read this our City Council has approved or is close to approving this group. Tybee needs to grow. We need to offer more and better services and facilities to our residents. But we are out of space. We are ocean, river, and marsh bound. Builders are consuming our available empty lots. We hope to shift our city's focus to planning for the future and taking action on a strategy for Memorial Park. We hope to provide more green space and modern facilities that meet the needs of all age groups. We have developed plans for the Park in the past, but we have not acted. We have new challenges. We will need your consideration, willingness to consider ideas, and thoughtful input for success.



#### Why? Why? WHY! What is with all the passwords?

If you are sick and tired of all the password changes you are constantly being asked to do, consider how much better it is to change your password now and again, than it is to go to your bank, have all your credit cards and checks destroyed, change all your automatic payments, switch all your credit card numbers for paying your bills, and explain to all your utility companies their payments are all being delayed. Sounds like a nightmare, no? It's actually quite a bit worse than you think! Time consuming, inconvenient, embarrassing, and a pain in the keister!

The criminals who did the hacking certainly have successfully used this information to steal real money, from companies and from people. They also sold the information they got to others, who also are using this information to steal even more. Then they put this information on the Dark Web, where other criminals can obtain it to do further damage.

But those are major hauls. These hackers also plant little viruses in all the computers they can, on literally hundreds of millions of computers. These little viruses sit quietly, not deleting files, not asking for ransom, just quietly trying to break into every login account they can find. If your login name happens to come up on one of their lists, thousands of computers will spend all day, every day, trying to guess your password. If you never change your password, it will eventually get

Yeah, changing your password is a good thing to do! Changing it several times per year is an important move to protect your finances and your privacy. You need to use a different password on every site you visit on the internet, because if they guess it on one, they'll try that login and password everywhere to see if you aren't one of the careless people who used the same password in multiple places.

Some sites are starting to use password-free access. When you try to login, they send you a verification code on your phone or email. Because only YOU should have your phone, when you respond with the code, they will let you in. If at all possible, always use a password AND the verification code method. This is called two-factor authentication, or 2FA. Another 2FA method uses an Authenticator application on your phone – Google, Microsoft, and some of the password managers have Authenticator apps, which all use a standard method to generate your code, which is based on your login, your physical phone, and the site you are trying to

You NEED a password manager. Password managers remember your passwords for you. They automatically type them for you, in a manner that most viruses can't even see. They automatically create random password strings for you. They remind you when you haven't changed your password in a while.

Password managers can cost anywhere from nothing to around \$60 per year. Compared to the possible loss you might experience otherwise, even the more expensive ones are well worth the investment!

The darling of the review sites right now is 1Password. I installed this for several different customers in the last half of 2023, and every one of them uninstalled it because it was too complicated. I currently use LastPass, which I like a lot, but my wife threatened me with beheading when I tried to install it on her computer. I have several customers who \*love\* DashLane, and the second most frequently recommended manager is BitWarden. I have yet to try either, although I will be trying out BitWarden soon, as my LastPass subscription is expiring soon. The BitWarden plan is among the lowest in cost and is said to be easy to use. I'll let you know. Norton's password manager is free, but not well supported, and Norton will try to get you to purchase the Norton security package, which is not really needed with Windows 10 or Windows 11. In the meantime, check one out and USE IT if it sounds good to you. Most have a short evaluation period, and you can pay by the month if you need more time to check it out.







## 2024 YMCA Critz Tybee Run Fest Brings 1200 Runners to Tybee for the Weekend

On February 2 and 3, the 2024 YMCA Critz Tybee Run Fest raced through the island, bringing more than 1200 runners and walkers on a winter off-season weekend. That's almost 300 more individual runners than in 2023, many of whom ran in multiple events: over 1840 finisher medals were given out over the course of the weekend's five timed events and free kids' run. The number is also only just short of the race's pre-pandemic level of registration, February of 2020 being the last year that the race was hosted by Critz Auto Group before generously gifting it to the YMCA of Coastal Georgia as a fundraising event and stepping back to the role of title sponsor.

That makes 2024 the third year that the local YMCA has hosted the 2-day event, retaining as much of its traditional format as possible and striving to keep it on its regular weekend, which brings racers and spectators to the beach destination in the off-season to fill hotel rooms and vacation rentals, eat in restaurants, fill up on gas and purchase souvenirs of their stay. This also means that all event proceeds remain local, supporting the YMCA of Coastal Georgia to provide scholarships for summer day camps and youth sports leagues, childcare and before-and after-school care support, and income-based assistance for memberships. Although Savannah has several major running events throughout the year, the YMCA Critz Tybee Run is the only one that serves as a nonprofit fundraiser.

Although each of the five events has a different course, winding through Tybee's neighborhoods and around the lighthouse, only one lane of Highway 80 is closed and the only other road closure is Tybrisa Street between Butler and the pier to accommodate the finish line for all courses. The foot of the pier serves as the race site with a large tent to keep runners and spectators warm and having fun, with sponsors providing food and drink, lively music by Gary Strickland, and a VIP area hosted by Savannah Magazine with cozy seating, locally made snacks and a mimosa bar.

Another priority of the race in respecting Tybee Island and its residents is in an effort to reduce the plastic waste produced by the event. Water stations are needed throughout each race for safety, with each runner potentially using a cup at multiple stations, which means a five-race event could need as many as 10,000 cups in order to keep everyone hydrated. That's why, for the second year in a row, the race has partnered with Hiccup Earth to provide sterile silicone cups at water stations that are used and then collected by Hiccup to be sterilized at their facility with restaurant equipment, before being transported to another race elsewhere. The Run Fest has also stopped serving beer to runners in plastic cups, opting instead for aluminum cans which can be more easily recycled, and by providing ample recycle bins available at the race site and across the course. These efforts help to keep waste from ending up on the beach or in the landfill.

Planning for the 2025 event is already in full swing: next year's race weekend will be Friday, January 31 and Saturday, February 1, with registration to open soon. Sponsorships are available for businesses of any size in a range of levels. Visit TybeeRunFest.com for more information.


