





DHL does not need you to contact them to get that package that you don't recall ever ordering — in fact, even if you ARE expecting something via DHL, it is almost guaranteed that they are not trying to reach you to complete any deliveries. The IRS does not take Green Dot cards in lieu of cash to pay your taxes and keep you out of jail. Ever. There is no Nigerian prince needing your help with a banking transaction, no matter how many millions he is trying to claim and share for your help.

If you are sitting at your computer, rest assured that Microsoft's technical support team will never surprise you with a flashing screen, a loud voice announcement, locking you out of your computer, and giving you a toll-free number to call.

Deep fakes can generate video of your least favorite political leader confirming every nasty rumor you ever heard about them. Combine this spectacular effect with efforts to prove that all news is fake, and it becomes easier to distrust factual reports and to trust crazy narratives that no one would ever have believed just a few years ago.

This doesn't mean there is no hope nor truth in the world, but you do have to treat all communication with strong skepticism. The more urgent the conmen make it sound, the more skepticism you should have about their claims. Don't call any numbers you are given, but GTS – Google that sh\*t - and confirm that the number on the web matches the number you are getting from the crooks. Joy decided to make this stew for the Soup Er November Soup Contest to support National Epilepsy Awareness Month. It did not win, but it's still excellent, so let's get it on.

### **Tuscan Chicken Stew Crockpot Style**



- 2 tbsp. butter
- 2 tbsp. olive oil
- 4 boneless chicken breasts uncooked and cut into bite size pieces
- 5 tsp. Italian seasoning
- S & P to taste
- 4 large red taters we used 1 baker and 5 small reds
- 2 cups baby carrots
- 1 cup celery, diced
- ½ cup green beans fresh or frozen we used frozen
- 1 26.5 oz. can of Cream of Chicken soup
- 2 cups of whole milk do not sub low fat it's a crockpot thing
- 2 cups ½ and ½
- 2 oz. dry ranch dressing mix

- Start out first by cubing your chicken and mixing it in with the Italian seasoning and adding salt and pepper to taste.
- Melt the butter on the bottom of the crock pot. Add the olive oil, veggies and chicken
- Mix together the soup, milk, ½ and ½ and ranch seasoning. Pour that goo on top of the chicken.
- Cover your crock and cook on LOW for 6-8 hours. Low and slow is the best with milk and dairy products.

The Cozy Cook recommends serving over biscuits, but the soup all by itself is going to fill you up and get you on the couch with your blanket, dog/cat and a good movie. The

There really is nothing like a good crockpot meal! Your house will smell amazing, you can do your day and come home to din din done and a warm belly after all is said and


On a side note, I was drinking vodka and diet coke when I tried this soup. I would recommend a nice red blend instead. Oooh, and maybe a tiny side salad.

# WHO GETS BURNT by a FREEZER?







The company was hired by the Libyan government run by Colonel Gaddafi to build a bridge over a man-made river in the Sahara Desert. Needless to say, the river never happened, but the bridge was built anyway because Gaddafi wanted it built. Of course, after Gaddafi realized what a mistake he had made, he didn't want to pay the Lannak company the money that was owed them. Lannak wouldn't even start on the project until the Libyans deposited five hundred million U.S. dollars in a German bank, but the 4 year project turned into a 6 year project because Gaddafi kept changing his mind. Now the Libvans owe Lannak four hundred million and they won't pay, so Lannak is suing them.

Everything seems cut and dry, because Lannak has all the records to support their case and all Mitch has to do is go to Libya, see the project and then represent Lannak in court. Easy peasy. Georgia found themselves on the outside looking in of this final year of the four-team playoff format. Was Georgia one of the four best teams? Yes. Was Georgia one of the four most deserving teams? Probably so. But in the end, the committee weighed heavily on the fact that Texas had beaten Alabama in Tuscaloosa and Alabama had beaten Georgia in the SEC Championship resulting in both having to be included, along with the undefeated Michigan and Washington teams. This will all become a moot point when the playoffs expand to 12 teams starting next season. It should have been 12 teams this year but some of the lesser conferences (ACC included) decided to form an alliance to block the implementation of the format and delay it until 2024. The bottom line, folks, is that Georgia had a hell of a run, winning 29 games over three years and two national championships. This old columnist never thought he would see another National championship after the Bulldogs won in 1980 but it happened. Twice! It's disappointing to not make this year's playoff, but it's great to be a Georgia Bulldog! Can't wait until Labor Day when we play Clemson in Atlanta.

We have one more regular season game before the playoffs in the NFL. And my August prediction of Baltimore and Dallas in the Super Bowl still has a chance. San Francisco seems to be the cream of the crop, but don't forget the Eagles in the NFC. Baltimore is currently the top seed in the AFC, but anything can happen with Miami, Kansas City, Jacksonville, and a host of other teams having a shot. The NFL wanted parity and boy do we have it for the most part this year. There are a few really good teams and a lot of OK teams, but far too many bad teams. This year has seen a tremendous number of quarterbacks go down with injuries in a league where there were only about a dozen decent ones to begin with. Regardless, playoff football is here, so let's enjoy it.

I hope 2024 brings you and your family Prosperity, Health, and Love! (And some great sports too.) Happy New Year and we'll see you in February.







# Time to bundle up, don't forget your plants!

Here we are, officially in the winter season. Although the temperatures have been fairly mild thus far, our plants are counting on us to be prepared for the dangers of cold weather and frost. Inevitably, every year I lose a plant or two because I forgot to protect it from a damaging winter freeze and kick myself since it only takes a few minutes to save a plant! So rather than staring at the dead thing all winter and waiting until spring to dig out the dead thing and replace it, try a few of these easy suggestions for saving your plants during the winter months:

**Containers** - Plants in containers are the most susceptible to damage of freezing

**Small containers:** If the container is small enough to move, ideally place it in the garage or a shed during the danger of frost, move it back out after danger of frost has passed. If this is not a possibility, pack them together as close to the house as you can and wrap the pots with a blanket or heavy sheet to protect the roots. A lighter sheet can be draped over the plants to shield them from the direct frost. Try to make sure the sheet is not touching the leaves by using stakes to keep the sheet from direct contact. Depending on your motivation level to go out in the cold, just placing the plants under the cover of a porch can often provide enough cover to avoid detrimental damage.


**Large containers:** If the container is too large and heavy to move the best bet is, again, to wrap the container in a blanket or heavy sheet to protect the roots. Like with the smaller containers, a lighter sheet can be draped over the plant to shield it from frost keeping the sheet from direct contact with the foliage.

#### **Landscape Plants/Young Trees**

Generally, both established and young landscape plants need a layer of mulch during the winter months. Place leaves, grass clippings, sawdust, straw or peat moss in a layer around the base of the plant or tree. Make sure the mulch layer is wide enough to cover the roots. Now we're out in the yard and the thought of draping sheets all over the trees and plants seems a little wackadoodle. Fortunately, the world of landscaping must have thought of this and created a handy dandy product called 'reemay.' Reemay is a cloth-like material that allows in light, heat and moisture, while it prevents harm from bugs, wind and frost. It's still a little on the sheet-like side but definitely has a more 'professional, I care about my plants' look.

Taking a few minutes to protect your plants and landscape investment is worth the time. Plants are expensive, especially trees! While sheets and blankies may save the plant or tree, I suggest spending a few bucks and getting the reemay that can be reused for years to come. Plus you don't have to wash or throw away dirty sheets and blankets, adding to your list of spring cleaning. Just fold up the reemay and store it for next year.

















## ARTIST OF THE MONTH - Casey Jones

#### Tips:

- Shoot during the "golden hour." That's the one-hour period after sunrise and before sunset when the lighting is softer and much more flattering.
- Try a prime or fixed lens. Not having a zoom lens will force you to move around and hopefully inspire creativity in framing your shot.
- Use the rule of thirds for a balanced photo. Look at your viewfinder as nine equal rectangles and put your subject on one of the lines instead of the center of the screen. This will help with composition.
- Don't let photos live on your phone. Get those special moments printed and hang them in your house so you can enjoy them every day.






### The Gift of the New Year

# **Beach Walks** with Dr. Joe

### **INVISIBLE COMB JELLIES**

My wife just walked in, saw me staring at my blank screen, and asked, "What are you thinking about?" My reply was. "How to start this month's article." I'm sitting here pondering: How do you introduce an animal that is nearly invisible in the water, without structure so much that it will slide between your fingers when you hold it in your hand, and it is also really slimy? So, with that, I'll introduce this month's animal, the Comb Jelly.

Comb jellies are practically invisible. They are so clear that most folks don't notice them when they are washed up. And when they are in the water, you pretty much don't see them at all. A Comb Jelly is a fragile, gelatinous, gooey, clear glob; but it is a living animal. When washed up, they appear only as a small, thin, flat, clear round area lying on the wet sand. If you haven't ever found one, don't worry, most go overlooked.

If you do find one lying in the wet sand, the best way to examine it is to carefully place it in a clear plastic bag with a little seawater. In water, the Comb Jelly will retain its normal shape. You will still have to look carefully to see it because it is so clear and transparent. You should be able to notice that it is generally shaped like a football with 8 lines running along its body, like the seams on a football. Each of these lines is actually a row of tiny comb-shaped structures having microscopic hair-like cilia forming the "teeth" of each comb. These comb-like structures are called "ctenes" (the "c" is silent). And the scientific name for Comb Jellies is thus Ctenophores. Sometimes it's possible to see the waves of movement of the microscopic cilia along the rows, and you may get lucky to see them make a moving rainbow of color due to the tiny cilia diffracting the sunlight.

Comb Jellies are not true "jelly fish" but rather belong to their own group in the animal kingdom (Ctenophores). They don't have tentacles and don't sting. Using the rows of tiny cilia to glide through the water, they eat microscopic







plankton. Most Comb Jellies live in the open ocean, far from shore, but we get a couple of species in our near shore waters. One is the football shaped "Sea Walnut." and the other is shaped more like a cup with a rounded bottom.

One of the things I find most interesting about Comb Jellies is their ability to produce flashes of bioluminescence, or flashes of light. Lots of deep-sea animals produce bioluminescence for a variety of reasons. Our inshore Comb Jellies retain this characteristic. Ours produce flashes of turquoise blue light along their comb rows. If it is a dark night and the water is calm, it's possible to see occasional flashes produced by Comb Jellies in the near shore water. If you've got one in a bag of seawater, set in the bathroom sink, and then later that night, with it totally dark, give the bag a shake. You might get a little light show!


